# Tanzania's Commitments and Role

- ❖ Tanzania adopted GEF Action Coalition on Economic Justice and Rights as a vehicle towards the realization of GEWE. Specific commitments:
  - Increase women's economic empowerment by transforming the care economy
  - Expand decent work and employment in formal and informal economies
  - Increase women's access to and control over productive resources
  - Promote gender-transformative economies and stimulus packages

# Key Elements & Strategies for Localization in Tanzania

## National Advisory Committee

A National GEF Advisory Committee that monitors and advises the President on GEF implementation progress. The Committee, includes 25 members from Tanzania Mainland and Zanzibar

## LGA Focal Persons

Appointment of Local Government Authority officials as GEF focal persons;

- 26 regions and 184 in councils of Tanzania mainland
- 5 regions and 6 in councils of Zanzibar

## TGEP Program

Tanzania Generation Equality multi-sectoral programme (TGEP) 2021-2026 was put in place to realize Tanzania's commitment to GEF, coordinated by the Ministry of Gender Mainland and Zanzibar.

## Inter-ministerial Focal Persons

Appointment of the inter-ministerial and Government Institution as GEF focal points to support monitoring, implementation, and reporting of the GEF in Tanzania.

# 2024 Multistakeholder Engagements for CSOs, Private Sector, Innovation Ecosystem and Academia

Tanzania has customised specific commitment areas and forms for each group. Accessed online and via QR codes.

## CSO Events - 4th and 10th September

Strengthening gender-responsive care services, supporting women in both formal and informal economies, promoting women's access to resources, and advocating for gender-responsive economic policies through targeted initiatives, training, and business support.

## Private Sector Event - 18th September

Advancing gender representation in companies and supply chains, providing inclusive benefits, and financing initiatives that empower women entrepreneurs through tailored financial products, business services, and training programs.



## Innovation Ecosystem Event - 3rd October

Fostering an innovation ecosystem that promotes gender equality by supporting women innovators and youth-led startups, with a focus providing resources, mentorship, and investment for women in both formal and informal economies.

## Academia Event - 3rd October

Establishing Women's Economic Empowerment Hubs in universities to integrate gender-responsive training, support female students and researchers, and advocate for gender-responsive economic policies through research and mentorship.

# Challenges and Solutions Towards Localization

## Challenges:

1. **Fragmented coordination among stakeholders:** (NGOs, private sector, government.)
2. **Systems for collecting data on the ground,** mostly still manual.

## Solutions:

- **Establish multi-stakeholder dashboard** to align goals, share resources, and ensure streamlined collaboration. We are launching a GEF website soon, and a dashboard to support in coordination and awareness.
- **Unitilse gender macro working group** for macro policies which constitutes representatives for different stakeholders.

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
